



# Justis – Irish Law Reports



**Irish Law Reports (ILRs):** Justis has an extensive coverage of ILRs, available from 1806 to present. The ILRs are available in full text, most of them as printable PDFs that replicate the pagination and appearance of the original hard copies. Each report includes catchwords and a headnote which summarizes the judgments.

## Sign In

Select Justis - you will be taken to the sign in page as shown below. Within DIT you do not need any login details, click **Continue to Justis**. For remote access you need, ID number & PIN.

## Quick Search

Enter any term or phrase into the search box as outlined in the example below. When searching by phrase, be sure to put quotations “ ” around the phrase you are searching for as shown below.

## Advanced Search

Cases

Looking for Cases? From the Justis toolbar click **Cases**, this brings up a new dialogue box where Irish Cases is pre-selected (this is what is covered by our subscription). Case reports can be looked up using any or all of the following options:

## Working with search results

To open any desired result, simply click on it. For example [DIGEST - Shannon v. McMahon](#), under the **Title and Subject** field and for the Full text click on the red PDF button () , where PDF is available.

Once a document is open, it will also provide other relevant links such as:



You can restrict the results to those that contain particular words, by typing a partial or whole word in the "Filter Results Profiles" text box.

## Browsing ILRs

From the top bar menu, click

 **Browse**  


Select **CASES**, further select **IRISH** from the available options. Click  [Irish Reports \(17229\)](#) to browse (by Year) all available ILRs. Select the year you are interested in and browse the cases available therein. The number in brackets after each year, (for example -  [1806 \(1\)](#) or [1839 \(264\)](#)) denotes the number of cases available in that particular year.

To display identified cases from the browsing session, tick the desired results  [1825 \(2\)](#)  [10 \(1\)](#)  [5 \(1\)](#) and click [Show Results](#) from the Top of the page.
