



What is it? ISI Web of Knowledge is a research platform, which hosts a variety of research resources. One of these is the **Web of Science** database, which offers access to journal articles and research material in the sciences (Science Citation Index), social sciences (Social Sciences Citation Index) and humanities (Humanities Citation Index). The database provides access to current and retrospective multidisciplinary information from circa 8,500 research journals. It also offers cited reference searching.

Where is it located on the DIT Library website?

- Web of Science is available on DIT Library's **Databases** list at <http://www.dit.ie/IT/Library/resources/databases/index.html>.
- It's possible to use Web of Science remotely from home or via the DIT wireless network. To access you will be asked for your Name, DIT ID and PIN.

Usage Tips

Web of Science can be searched using general, advanced (Booleans and field tags) or a cited reference type search (find the citations to a person's work). E-tutorial links are provided for all these search types.

If the journal issue indexed by Web of Science is subscribed to by DIT Library you will be able to obtain the full text using the *ArticleLinker* facility.

If you register with ISI Web of Knowledge you can take advantage of various personalised current awareness services such as *Citation Alerts*, *Saved Searches*, *Custom Journal Lists*, *EndnoteWeb* and *Table of Contents Alerts*.
