



What is it ?

iSURV is an award winning online information service from RICS (Royal Institute of Chartered Surveyors) books. It is an electronic publication in its own right and also links to hundreds of other complete electronic documents.

iSURV contains publications and information in the subject areas of Building Surveying, Commercial Property, Construction, Disputes, Environment, Planning and valuation. It also contains the **RICS Red Book** – the manual of RICS appraisal and valuation standards.

How to use it:

iSURV can be accessed via the link on the database list on the library website. Alternatively it can be accessed from <http://www.isurvlive.co.uk> . A password is required to access iSURV, it can be got from the library desk at D.I.T. Bolton Street.

Once into iSURV you will see a list on the left hand side of the main subject areas which are covered. If any of these headings have a '+' beside them, clicking this will expand to a list of individual chapters which the user can select from. For example, open the Environment module, open the chapter on Environmental Impact Assessments, start at the section headed Practical and work your way through using the **Next page** ➡ arrow. The information you retrieve can be printed or saved.

The tabs at the top of the screen will bring up additional material relevant to the material you are viewing. For example if you are viewing the construction material, clicking on the tab marked 'RICS material index' will bring up 46 additional documents dealing with various aspects of construction. There are also tabs for bringing up 'Key Cases' and 'Forms and Precedents'.

Searching is very easy and there is an 'Advanced Search' option which will retrieve items which have 'all these words', 'one or more words', 'exact phrase' or 'words near each other'.
