



# BAILII

***The British and Irish Legal Information Institute (BAILII)*** provides access to the most comprehensive set of British and Irish primary legal materials available, free of charge on the Internet. BAILII includes 34 databases covering 6 jurisdictions - Ireland, Northern Ireland, Scotland, Wales, England, United Kingdom. BAILII is hosted in Ireland by the Law Faculty of the National University of Ireland, Cork. The databases are derived from a number of sources including published CD-ROMs and feeds by relevant courts, government departments and other organizations.

## Getting started:

Login to the library web site at [www.dit.ie/library](http://www.dit.ie/library). Select *Search by Subject*, then *Law* from the alphabetical subject list. Use the *Subject Databases* option at the top of the screen and select *BAILII* from the listing displayed. Alternatively, go straight to the BAILII site at <http://www.bailii.org/>. The Irish Legislation section of the database contains the full text of Irish Statutes from 1922 to date. It currently contains 3000 statutes.

## Searching:

**Basic:** If the full name of the piece of legislation is known it is possible to do an alphabetical title search by clicking on the relevant letter. This will open a list of statutes in alphabetical order. A keyword search can be carried out if the name of the actual piece of legislation is not known.

## Database Search:

Select *Database Search*. At the Find box scroll down the drop-down menus and select the required search.. Enter keyword (s)/phrase in the Enter Search Query box combining terms with the operators AND, OR, NOT where necessary. In the Select the BAILII database box, scroll down to select the Database to search. Click on the *Search Box*. . It is also possible to search multiple databases at once by holding down the control key on the keyboard. *Additional Options* tick boxes allow the sorting of results by relevance and/or the limiting of results displayed at any one time.

## World Law Search:

Click on the *World Law* link at the top of the main screen to search on the World Law Information Institute homepage. This service provides information on international law and legislation, news items, links and categories. Enter keywords or phrases combining them as above with the operators AND, OR, NOT in the *Find Box*.

## Printing:

Tick boxes beside selected articles to mark for later printing. Select the *Print* tab for print options. Select the desired display method – full citation, title only etc. Select *Print* again.
